

Tuggeranong United recorded its first Premier League win of the season, downing the previously undefeated Woden Valley 2-1 at Woden Enclosed Oval on Sunday.

With Woden one of the season's biggest improvers, Sunday's clash loomed as a tricky fixture for Tuggeranong, but the visitors put in their best display of the year, dominating the contest from the outset.

With defenders Tim Ireson and Jeremy Butler quickly repelling any Woden raids, Tuggeranong, through hard-working midfielders Steve Oxford and Simon Gemmell, was able to dictate play for much of the 90 minutes.

Two second-half goals, including a 25 metre thunderbolt from Oxford, put the result beyond doubt, with Woden's late strike coming only when the contest was all but over.

Tuggeranong United coach Darren Viskovich was very pleased with his side's win, which was his first since taking over the reins in late 2008.

"We played very well and dominated the game for large parts," Viskovich said.

"Hopefully we can build on this result and take some confidence into next week's game against Canberra City."

Tuggeranong United takes on Canberra City at Kambah 2 on Saturday at 3pm.
